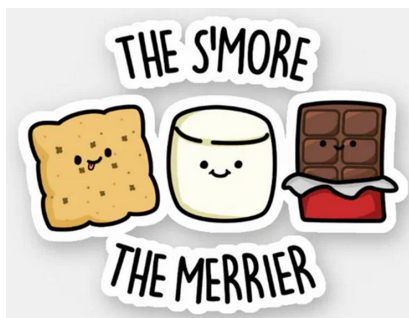

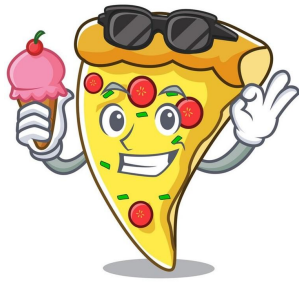
The Kick-off will also be available via Zoom for unit leaders outside of Bakersfield.

Webelos & Arrow of Light

New Camping Guidelines



Effective June 1, 2024, Webelos is the designated program for 4th graders and Arrow of Light is the designated program for 5th graders. As such, the Arrow of Light program is no longer combined with the Webelos program and the purpose of Webelos (4th grade) is no longer to prepare Cub Scouts to join Scouts BSA. The purpose of the Arrow of Light program is to prepare for Arrow of Light Scouts to join a Scouts BSA troop.

- Only Webelos Scout dens and Arrow of Light dens/patrols may conduct den coordinated overnight campouts. Webelos Scout dens and Arrow of Light dens/patrols coordinated overnight campouts are restricted to no more than two consecutive nights.
- Webelos den or Arrow of Light den/patrol coordinated camping is only for the youth members of those dens/patrols, their parents, and their registered adult leadership.
- Webelos den and Arrow of Light den/patrol coordinated campout must have a BALOO trained adult leader in attendance and all of Scouting's Youth Protection policies apply. Reminder – Cub Scout overnight camping is limited to their council's designated locations with appropriate facilities.
- During Webelos Scout dens and Arrow of Light den/patrol camping, each Scout should attend with their parent(s) or legal guardian(s). A Webelos Scout or Arrow of Light Scout whose parent or legal guardian cannot attend a Webelos den or Arrow of Light patrol overnight camping trip may participate under the supervision of at least two registered leaders. The leaders and a parent or legal guardian must agree to the arrangement, and all Youth Protection policies apply.
- Webelos Scouts and Webelos Scout dens may not participate at a Scouts BSA troop unit campout or at a Scouts BSA "camporee" or other events designed for Scouts BSA during the day and/or overnight, even as visitors.

* **Guidelines for Arrow of Light Scouts Camping Overnight with Scouts BSA**

- Arrow of Light Scouts can participate and camp at a unit coordinated campout with a Scouts BSA troop they are eligible to join. They must attend as an Arrow of Light den/patrol under the supervision of two deep leadership from their Arrow of Light den/patrol or pack. All Cub Scout camping requirements still apply, including the Arrow of Light den/patrol must have a BALOO trained adult leader in attendance and all of Scouting's Youth Protection policies apply.
- Arrow of Light Scouts may participate at a Scouts BSA "camporee" (council coordinated, short-term camp, see NCAP SA-001) during the day and/or overnight in one of two ways:
 1. **With their Arrow of Light Den/Patrol.** Arrow of Light Scouts can attend as an Arrow of Light den/patrol under the supervision of two deep leadership from their Arrow of Light den/patrol or pack. The Arrow of Light Scout's parent or legal guardian(s) may attend with the Arrow of Light den/patrol and their child, either alongside the two-deep leadership or as part of it if they are registered with the pack. Or
 2. **As an Individual Scout.** Arrow of Light Scouts can attend with their parent(s) or legal guardian(s) if the local council coordinates two deep leadership per NCAP Standard HS-502.

What is Wood Badge?

Wood Badge is the most advanced training course for adults offered by Scouting America. The training course is rich in Scouting history and tradition.

Prerequisites:

- Be registered adult member of Scouting America.
- Have completed basic training requirements for your registered Scouting position prior to the course.
- Be capable of functioning safely in an outdoor environment. All participants are required to complete the **Annual Health and Medical Record (parts A, B and C)** :

HAZARDOUS WEATHER TRAINING



It's time to renew your **Hazardous Weather Training (HWT)**.

HWT is REQUIRED to be renewed every 2 years (National Scouting America requirement) for ALL leader positions. Leadership positions with expired **HWT** are considered 'untrained' and do not qualify for recharter or working with youth.

Ensure you have the most current information in weather safety this summer by updating your HWT on My.Scouting.org.

Login to My.Scouting.org any time to retake Hazardous Weather Training.

(Note: It will NOT be 'assigned' to you. You can retake **HWT** at any time.)

Cub Scout BB gun shooting must be conducted by trained, qualified, on-site rangemasters who direct the operation of the range program and BB gun shooting instruction. The ratio of BB gun rangemasters to shooters is 1-to-8 on the firing line. Cub Scout Archery must be conducted by trained, qualified on-site Rangemasters who direct the operation of the range program and archery instruction.

QUALIFICATIONS

To qualify as a BB gun rangemaster, the rangemaster must be at least 18 years old and be trained by a National Camping School–trained shooting sports director or a National Rifle Association rifle instructor.

To qualify as an Archery rangemaster, the rangemaster must be 18 years old and be trained by a National Camping School–trained shooting sports director, or USA Archery level 1 instructor.

The Cub Scouts rangemaster also must be registered with Scouting America.

Safety in Scouting

Incident Reporting Helps

Timely and complete incident reporting provides Scouting America with an opportunity for analysis of incidents that occur and promotes continuous improvement of our programs. In our experience, the sooner a clear, concise, and complete incident report is made, the sooner that an appropriate response to the incident can occur.



GENERAL INFORMATION

What is an incident? There are three types of reportable incidents:

- Near Miss—A near miss does not result in injury, illness, or damage, by definition, but it had the potential to do so.
- General Liability—Events or allegations of injury, illness, or property damage, including employment, director, and officer issues.
- Youth Protection/Membership Infraction—Allegations of abuse, violations of Scouting America guidelines or policies, or inappropriate behavior by a Scout/Scout leader/parent/other.

Why report an incident? The information reported from incidents helps identify areas for improvement so we can help prevent the reoccurrence of similar incidents. Scouting America cannot address a concern if we do not know about it. Reporting incidents promptly is also critical so Scouting America can respond in a timely manner and manage claims properly.

When do I report an incident? You should immediately contact your local council to report and get assistance with serious, fatal or abuse incidents. Report within 24 hours if an injury or illness cannot be treated by Scout-rendered first aid, a medical professional such as a doctor or nurse was needed, or an ambulance was called.

How do I report an incident? There are incident reporting tools to assist you in collecting the facts of the incident to provide to the council. This is available on the council website www.sscbsa.org. Scroll down on the home page to "Incident Reporting Tools".

Reporting tips: It is important that incident reports are filled out as completely & timely as possible. This

will help bring clarity to the situation and avoid unnecessary calls or emails for additional information. Photographs of the site, facilities, vehicles, or equipment can add value to the report. Remember to include only pertinent facts about the incident. Do not assign blame or include personal opinions. Stick to the facts.
